Lobbying and trade association activity policy

Energy Absolute Public Company Limited prioritizes the importance of transparency and accountability of the public policy and lobbying actions. It is the Company's accountability to ensure that all lobbying activities must comply with the law and regulation. In additions, the Company shall encourage the transparency and consistency of Lobbying and trade association activity policy including review and monitor assessment process whether public policy engagements and lobbying are aligned with the Paris Agreement.

Lobbying

Interaction with government officials at all levels is highly regulated. Employees are generally discouraged from engaging in lobbying (either directly or indirectly) of government officials or government employees without first obtaining consultation from the management team. Before engaging in any lobbying activities, employees are instructed to ask for an opinion of the management team to ensure that any lobbying activities are compliant with applicable laws, including those regarding the disclosure of lobbying activities. In addition, outside consultants may not be retained or otherwise engaged to lobbying on behalf of the company without prior approval from the management team.

Trade associations

The company participates in trade associations for numerous reasons such as networking, building industry skills and monitoring of industry policies and trends. The Company may make payments such as membership fees for the participation in trade associations, including membership on a trade association board. This does not mean that the company agrees with every position a trade association takes on an issue. In fact, from time to time our corporate positions may differ from those of the trade association of which we are members. In addition, the Company shall review its position with the direction of such trade association.
